## Film records memories of Holocaust

For as long as Hamilion resident Sicve Resserman can remember, be's been bearing the stories bellint the five numbers uiltooed on his parents' arms.
His mother Aranka, especially. talked opealy to his sister and him about her experience growing up as a Jewish girf in Hungary during the Holocaust,
Thirtyfive years ago, Besser man asked his mother to write down ber journey through the concentration camps, recognizing the importance of sharing these mem ories with generations to come. He knew it would be an emotionally draining task and never expected her to present three spiral notebooks to him six weeks later, filled with her story of survival.
